Greg Albritton Strongly Opposes Proposed Conecuh Woods Garbage Dump

Atmore, AL – Greg Albritton has taken a strong stance against the proposed Conecuh Woods Garbage dump.

“I have never been, nor will I ever be, in favor of such a project. I will fight to keep our communities free and clear of landfills and the garbage that comes with them,” stated Albritton

The proposed Conecuh Woods landfill project has become a hot button issue to many of the residents of state senate district 22. According to the Citizens for a Clean Southwest Alabama website, the proposed landfill would become the largest of its kind in the United States upon completion. It would store household refuse from around the country. Potentially, it would have a damaging impact on a large portion of Southwest Alabama as a result of transporting the refuse to the site and what it would do over time to the water table.

The proposed project has not yet been presented to the Conecuh County Commission for their review. Upon submittal of the proposal, the county commission has ninety days to vote on it, or their inaction would result in an automatic approval.

As your state senator, Albritton will not only fight to ensure the proposed landfill site in Conecuh County will not be constructed, he will also protect the interests of his constituency and all state residents by taking a hands on approach in passing the legislation necessary to strengthen the local and county governments ability to “keep their communities free and clear of garbage.”
